The scenes seemed almost post-apocalyptic: To my right, the front of a clothing shop had been sheared off and the legs of a mannequin had been amputated, leaving her head and torso lying on the floor halfway across the room from her limbs. To my left, an apartment building had shed half the tiles on its façade. None of its windows were intact, and a bush was growing on the second floor where a chunk of wall had given way.

Street after street in the town of Huayang, in China's Sichuan Province, testified to the shattering power unleashed here during the great and tragic earthquake of 2008. As I walked these abandoned roadways, many of them still piled with debris from that disaster, I thought of the families who had once made their homes here, the shopkeepers who has sold their wares here, the children who had lived and played and grown up amid this now-crumbling asphalt, brick and tile.

I saw a sign next to one pile of debris: Ruins generate hopes. It was an odd phrase. But then, while I don't think this is exactly how the writer of the sign meant it, it occurred to me that this place, these buildings, these creations of man in their destroyed state did generate hope—by reminding me of what really matters.

Lord, no building code in the world can give us the security that we crave.

No mortar can hold the bricks in place with the surety that we want,

No human construct is capable of providing the framework that we need.

Pastor Report

- Confirmation class started on Sunday mornings at 11:00 following worship service. Pastor Tim Voth is leading 8 students and several observers using Luther's Small Catechism.
- Pastor likes the help with greeting and thanks the people that have been doing such a great job of welcoming people.
- Sept 8 is Mission Sunday with Louis and Jane Faulstich. They will speak about their mission with Wycliff Bible Translators so this will take the place of the sermon.
- LCMC convention is in Omaha Sept. 29-Oct. 2. Pastor and Sharon will leave after church on Sunday. Anyone else is invited to come along. We can have two delegates.
- Pastor and Sharon will be celebrating his sister and brother-in-law's 50th wedding anniversary and will be gone Aug. 28- Sept. 4th.

Property Committee

- ADA bathroom remodel approved at annual meeting with \$13,000 limit. Doors have been installed and plumbing starts soon. Discussion on importance of handrails for safety. (Tom Luers huge thanks for being
- New sound system approved at the annual meeting with \$24,000 limit. Church computers will also be upgraded. (Steve Letcher) sound system is installed with \$22,000 used so far. - Council agreed for Denny to donate the old sound boards to bible camp.
- Air conditioning update: We have four units running.
- Request to Property Team to open up north end of fellowship room to make more room and extend our usage of space. A motion was made to give Property Committee permission to open this part of the fellowship room with cleaning out and dispersing of unused items along with permission to fix the dividing doors between sanctuary and fellowship room.
